Today we welcome Larkhall Athletic to the Mangata Pay UK Stadium Meadow Park for todays very important FA Cup 3rd Round Qualifier. May I wish their Directors, Manager, Players and Supporters a pleasant stay with us and a safe journey home.

Well, it's now just over two weeks since Luke Garrards return to the dug out and with two important victories, one in the league the other in the FA Cup, with seven goals scored and none conceded, it's been a very happy return thus far for Luke and long may that continue.

In that time we have also signed wing back/ fullback Jayden Richardson, so may I wish a warm welcome to Jayden and hope his time with us is both happy and successful.

Today we have got one or two of our injured players back for today's game, and with Jayden's signing we will come into this afternoon in high spirits with a possible 18/19 fit players from what is a very well balanced 20-man squad.

With today being all about the FA Cup, it does allow us to name 7 substitutes for this afternoon's game. That said, I'm not sure how relevant that really is at this stage of the competition, as you can only field five of those and in truth it just cannot be an advantage for smaller clubs from the lower levels. As it just adds to their budget and so many of those clubs tend to put their youth players on the bench in these games to fill those spaces.

As an aside and in terms of your reactions to our recent managerial change, I've received a lot of texts, emails, calls and even third party observations from a number of you, and of course I do respect many of your opinions, but in the end I must always go with my instincts and with my gut feeling.....

However, it was still nice to know that 99% of you did agree with my decision making in relation to Luke's return and importantly understood my timing.

CLUB INFO

Over the next few months I aim to push on with my vision for the South (Away) End of the ground including a new South Stand, Turnstiles and Fan Zone, which would include a later provision to future proof the West and East Stands with the extra seating needed should we ever got into the EFL.

I'm hoping my long-standing collaborations with HBC Councillors, Planners and their Officers will finally get us some sort of clarity on how HBC's Brook Road Car Park vision/plans will look shortly, so we can once again enter into more progressive cross party, football club, park user and resident discussions.

I'm particularly interested in how we can all come together to improve the Park, improve the Park Entrance at the Brook Road Car Park (including its safety), with the Club given the future space we need to create the 5,000 capacity Stadium, with the 2,000 seats that will allow our entry into the Football League should we ever get there.

After years of going round in circles, so much still needs to be addressed re the Park and Brook Road Car Park, including final design, HBC development costs and overall build costs. As present ground levels and stuff like soil analysis, contaminated soil, topographical surveys and most importantly an updated overall budget still need urgent attention.

It's very clear to me, that HBC Officers must re-look at their outdated budgets re Brook Road Car Park and Meadow Park and re-focus on its park users, our visitors and the foot fall of BWFC, AWFC, AFC and Away supporters, who we constantly encourage into our town and into the local area, as things have changed dramatically in the last four years after the pandemic.

It's also important we deal with what our park users and our residents actually want - but before we get too hooked up on all that, we must all first see what HBC's final plans are and importantly then sign off on a project that we can all believe in.

At my age and with my experience I will not lie, as alarm bells and red flags are telling me that BWFC still need our own ambitions future proofed by HBC. We still need to be given the land earmarked six or seven years ago and given the length of lease with the community discount attached as promised by HBC and their Officers.

That was a promise made openly to me both verbally in meetings and in writing, as long as i invested and got others to invest into our facility and if I continued to bring third party spend, community benefit, plus further personal investment not only into the Ward of Cowley but throughout our Community.

I've not only done that, I've also spent in my time here tens of millions, I've created new partnerships, created community hubs, community initiatives and took what was a ram shackle Council owned facility and transformed it into what it is today. In my 26 seasons here, I believe I've transformed our Club, the team, our support base, our ambitions and the whole Stadium into something we can all be proud of.

Suddenly though, it feels like selected memory has hit some people regarding BWFC's ambitions and my HBC's lease, and though the length of my lease is a non negotiable for me after the tens of millions i've spent, there appears to be some push back at HBC Executive and Officer level in terms of the promises they made when i only seek people to honour their word.

All of which in real terms means that I cannot fully trust people or plan ahead and that is vital for me to remain at BWFC and to continue spending my money future proofing our spiritual home and our very existence.

Of course we would also like a quick promotion back to the National League this season haha, but mostly I need an understanding from Local Councillors and not broken promises from HBC Executives or Officers regarding what my long standing legacy is or might look like, in other words i need certainty and the lease promises made to me must be honoured.

I'm now at an age where my local knowledge, experience, design know how, budget skills, operational practicality and knowledge of HBC and these Park and Car Park type builds and similar projects are going to be very important factors regarding our Stadium completion and our associated surrounding developments.

When you add in the monies that i either put in personally, continue to raise or continue to generate, all that will be needed in abundance if we are to complete our future club projects both on schedule and on budget. In truth a completed Stadium and facility is perhaps the greatest legacy I can now give to our supporters, our club, our town and to our community.nAs such I have accepted all manner of delays from HBC re the Meadow Park and the Brook Road Car Park builds, as I understood that perhaps they were inevitable after the pandemic.

That said, let's get real here, after more than five years of watching people change their minds and me seeing ill thought through designs, whilst also witnessing a change in local political Leadership at HBC. All this has meant our community is still waiting for any tangible progress around the Park to happen.

In that time, I've personally brought in further millions in build spend in and around our facility, I've created further third party spend into our high street, I've brought in hundreds of thousands of extra BWFC, AWFC, AFC home and away supporters, who all use our train station, the buses, most walk through our high street and go into our pubs, restaurants, many park their cars in our car parks and use

our petrol stations and newsagents etc.

For 25 years or more i've worked very closely with both HBC and it's Officers like Hilary Shade and worked very hard recently with my friends at Arsenal FC and Arsenal Women FC in getting two new 10 year contracts with them over the line.

I also succeeded this September in bring the recent UEFA Women's qualifying tournament into our community. This involved Arsenal Women, Athletico Madrid, Glasgow Rangers and Rosenberg.... Again what an accolade for our Town and Club and again this meant four local hotels were full and it brought prestige and a lot of associated third party spend into our local economy with close on 6,000 spectators attending the games over the two days of competition.

In my time here along with my partners at AFC, we have built a new award winning Main Pitch, built the North Bank, built the Clubs new Entrance Road, built a new all singing all dancing Broadcast compound. I've refurbed the East Stand, I've built the Glass House, rebuilt Ricko's and Oscars, I've re-built the Astro Pitches and the whole of the home Car Park.

We've also built new fan Pathways and installed safer Lighting onsite, we've installed new Floodlights, new CCTV, new Sound Systems, new Signage and more Toilets. We've built a new Scoreboard, rebuilt our Offices, rebuilt our rehab Gym and refurbed our Study Suites, we've even dealt with the Councils contaminated land and soil issues, at a cost approaching £200k.

Oh and in case anyone forgot haha, in the last four or five years i oversaw a club that beat AFC Wimbledon, Bristol Rovers, AFC Bournemouth and took our Town to the 5th Round of the FA Cup up at Goodison Park. So please, please, please let's not allow HBC's Executive or Officers to suddenly get selective memory on what future proofing our existence now means. Let's not rest on our laurels now, let all of us together go again, let all of us build our

legacy knowing that BWFC's, EFL ambitions are paramount for our clubs future and must continue

In the last four years, I acknowledge that we have had a Splash Park in Meadow Park built for us. However the trade off seemingly is that the entrance to our beloved Meadow Park and the land adjacent to our Stadium at the away end of Brook Road Car Park, is now in a complete state of disrepair, and after more than four years of me asking, pleading and begging, it still looks more like a building site with no end in site.

In that time, I have seen our Meadow Park changing rooms decommissioned and a 100 tons of muck away left in three areas around the Park. I've watched our Meadow Park community pitches left in a continual state of neglect and now they are shamefully very rarely used and have NO changing rooms. Even our park pathways are mostly in a state of disrepair with pot holes and debris everywhere which is both dangerous and worrying.

As such I feel it is time for me, Hertsmere Borough Council, it's Planners, Councillors, it's Officers and even my architect Paul Beech to get back into a room and push ourselves to find solutions to get this Car Park, Meadow Park and our future plans back on track.

These things are all within HBC's gift and the adjacent land next to the entrance of BWFC at the South End of the Stadium, desperately needs to be re-designed and we desperately need to get relationships and our long standing friendships with HBC and its Officers back on an even keel.

Of course I accept things might take time, but at my age time is running out and if HBC kick this can down the road any further, then they may never give me the time to get things back up to speed. I already know it will take further time to get everyone's agreement and get a full planning application through and in truth if we waste any more time for no good reason, i might as well walk away.

Of course the next step will take around the table meetings to get things back on track and re-designed. Of course It will take all of our collective experience and know how to get things re-costed fully, and for some of our officers it means they will have to stretch themselves to truly understand what our town, our residents and our park users actually need without the true local knowledge needed as they work through a project of this size.

As an aside, for those who don't know, I was heavily involved in building thousands of sets as a Property Master within the British Film Industry, a career that took me problem solving all around the world and one I enjoyed immensely for more than two decades. I worked for Warner Brothers, Walt Disney, 20th Century Fox, Paramount, Miramax, Universal on big productions such as, A View to a Kill, Shakespeare in Love, Batman, Hamlet, Charlie and the Chocolate Factory, Alfie and many, many more.

So I do know a thing or two about collaborations, budgets, production design, builds, groundworks, schedule of works, problem solving and realistic work programmes. I also know that you do need to have the necessary experience and to have both budget and design control.

I know you must have intelligent architects and experienced project and site managers. You must, must, must also have the right type of contractors to work with in all the right areas. For that you need a realistic budget, you need onsite expertise at the very top, because ultimately we are the problem solvers and you must always have sensible contingency plans.

You also need realistic timelines, you need a well thought through schedule of works and works programme, above all you need experienced people and true collaborators at the helm. Trust me this whole project is a simple one, even though it will take in a lot of ground works in four large areas namely Brook Road Car Park, Meadow Park and importantly [though slightly forgotten] in and around our

Football Clubs service road and the new South Entrance to our ground.

In truth for a project of this size, we will firstly need cross party and resident support, we will need strong leadership, we will need experience, we will need skill at design level and we will need an experienced project manager and architect at the planning, pre-build, build and completion stages..... Trust me all of those things if people listen will save HBC hundreds of thousands of pounds.

My track record over time in both film and at this football club, shows that we have the skill sets needed at the Club to help HBC build these type of projects on budget, on schedule and I feel if its officers and planners listen, we already have the team to help them get this job done in a timely manner.

If our Councillors back themselves, back me and back this football club, as much as they've recently backed another local football club in Potters Bar Town (I'm told to the tune of one million pounds). Then what we do here will bring further millions into our town and community through third party spend, with those monies going into our high streets, our retail parks, our petrol stations, pubs, restaurants, newsagents and into the pay to park Council run car parks.

Thus ensuring HBC get a return on their money and get Park and Car Park upgrades they aspire to. Getting a return really does matter to the livelihoods of our local shop keepers, publicans, restauranteurs, retailers, and to HBC and our local rate payers.

My aim would be to once again offer my services 'free' to HBC, but I'd look to work again with my Architect Paul Beech and with HBC on finalising the design. I might even approach other partners for further support and backing.

I would commit myself to contributing hugely into the BWFC side of the project, but also talk to the Football Foundation, BWFC, BW PASE Ltd, AFC, AWFC, the WSL and Sport England to see if they could assist me in future proofing our facility?

If those things are done in a timely manner, I'd be confident of HBC getting an agreed Planning Application through by late 2024 or early 2025. With a first phase start date re Brook Road Car Park and Meadow Park starting in and around the late Spring/early Summer of 2025, with their first and second phase completion dates being in or around the Summer of 2026.

If that was done, I would be quietly confident that the third phase of this project, namely the BWFC South Stand, including entrance road, turnstiles, away fanzone, catering unit, toilets and a stand alone grounds and maintenance building, could start in late 2026 with a possible completion date of the Summer of 2027?

ACADEMY INFO

In terms of the Academy, we have improved our infra structure hugely over the last 12 months, by adding further minibuses, people carriers, S and C Staff, Analysts, Medical Staff and by bringing in Coaches of the calibre of Ross Weare, Micky Engwell, Danny Woodards, Jordan Kelly and Richard Pett to support our already vibrant Sports Education Programme.

That in my opinion must be seen as just the start of further improvements, with further thought now being put into the next phase of the Academy recruitment process. As such I expect a Development think tank with real energy to be put in place over the next 3 months.

It is my plan to create a small development budget next season to bring in 2, 3 or even 4 young pros by next pre season, who I envisage would of been released from within the pro game between now and next spring/summer.... Whilst also creating a loan management team that will I hope include first team Coach Ross Weare, Academy Lead Micky Engwell and Senior Academy Coach Danny Woodards.

These things of course take time, with perhaps further thought and money needed, but importantly it will also need senior members of our football set up to head this up.... These people will of course include Charlie Hunter my 'Sporting Director', Luke Garrard my 'Head Of Football' and Billy Hunter my 'Head of Academy' on the administrative side.

In truth these building blocks are not radical, but to do things correctly will take good scouting, a good eye, a bit of patience and a more measured approach. As such we will start putting these things in place as early as October of this year.

Anyway back to today and back to the magic of the FA Cup, as it's about remembering all the highs and the lows that only this competition can bring. Today no doubt Larkhill Athletic and their supporters will arrive here as underdogs, ready to be a part of their own FA Cup history and hoping to spring yet another one of those FA Cup shocks that make this competition so special.

Our response is to embrace the challenge of being a favourite today, and not to be complacent. As such I hope we can do the job in front of us, especially with us having home advantage and to do it at the first attempt.

A win today would take either team to within 90 minutes of the 1st Round Proper of the FA Cup, and from there who knows where fate and God might take you?

Lastly whoever you support, let's hope for an open, attacking game and may the best team win.

ROUTE TO THE THIRD ROUND QUALIFYING

LARKHALL ATHLETIC

The Larks began their 2024/25 Emirates FA Cup journey in the preliminary round with a win away to Hartley Wintney, despite the home side dominating much of play.

Jake Hicks opened the scoring early after a pass from Max Williams, and Ryan Beckinsale doubled the Larks' lead just before halftime with a header. Hartley had numerous chances, but Larkhall keeper Adam Forster made multiple key saves. Hartley pressed throughout but couldn't break through, and Larkhall advanced.

In first round qualifying, Larkhall travelled to Barnstaple town. After a goalless first half, it didn't take long for the Larks to find the breakthrough early on in the second through Eben Mortimer-Taylor. Lewis Graham would double the lead in the 80th minute with Barnstaple pulling one back 5 minutes later, but the Larks held on to progress.

The Larks were away again in second round qualifying as Ollie Price's side travelled to nearby Frome Town, a step above them at step 3 in the English football pyramid. Zak Drew came close for Larkhall in the first half, while Ethan Vaughan was a rare bright spot for Frome.

Max Phillips rattled the Frome crossbar soon after the break and the only goal came in the 70th minute, Larkhall's Harvey Pritchard tapping home a rebound after a good save from Frome's Kyle Phillips. In the dying minutes, Frome Town's Curtis Jemmett-Hutson fired over, but an equaliser wouldn't come, and the Larks progressed to third round qualifying at the Mangata Pay UK Stadium Meadow Park.

DAVID v GOLIATH

Football historian **LEIGH EDWARDS** looks at the eight most famous post-war FA Cup upsets where non-League clubs defeated top-flight opponents

1947/48 COLCHESTER 1 v HUDDERSFIELD 0

Southern League side Colchester United faced First Division Huddersfield Town in the FA Cup third round at Layer Road on 10th January 1948. Bob Curry's second-half goal gave the following Colchester team an epic 1-0 victory in front of 16,005: Harry Wright, Digger Kettle, Bob Allen, Harry Bearryman, Ted Fenton, Andy Brown, Dennis Hillman, Bob Curry, Arthur Turner, Fred Cutting, Len Cater. Colchester beat Bradford City 3-2 in the fourth round before losing 5-0 at eventual finalists Blackpool. Arthur Turner had played for Charlton in the 1946 FA Cup final. The U's were elected to the Football League two years later.

The Huddersfield team was: Bob Hesford, Bill Hayes, Jeff Barker, Les Smith, George Hepplewhite, Eddie Boot, Conway Smith, Jimmy Glazzard, Alf Whittingham, Peter Doherty, Vic Metcalfe

1948/49 YEOVIL 2 v SUNDERLAND 1

Southern League side Yeovil Town faced bigspending Sunderland in the FA Cup fourth round at the Huish on 29th January 1949. Player-manager Alec Stock's first-half goal was equalised by Sunderland's Jackie Robinson but Eric Bryant scored an extra-time winner for the following Yeovil team in front of 17,000: Dickie Dyke, Arthur Hickman, Ralph Davies, Bob Keeton, Les Blizzard, Nick Collins, Bobby Hamilton, Alec Stock, Eric Bryant, Ray Wright, Jack Hargreaves. The Glovers had already beaten Romford 4-0, Weymouth 4-0 and Bury 3-1 but lost 8-0 at Manchester United in the fifth round watched by 81,565.

The Sunderland team was: Johnny Mapson, Jack Stelling, Barney Ramsden, Willie Watson, Fred Hall, Arthur Wright, Len Duns, Jackie Robinson, Ronnie Turnbull, Len Shackleton, Tommy Reynolds.



1971/72 HEREFORD 2 v NEWCASTLE 1

Twelve days after Southern League side Hereford United drew 1-1 at Newcastle in the FA Cup third round, the two sides met again in the replay at Edgar Street on 5th February 1972. Malcolm Macdonald gave Newcastle the lead but Ronnie Radford grabbed a spectacular late equaliser and Ricky George the extratime winner: Fred Potter, Roger Griffiths (Ricky George), Ken Mallender, Alan Jones, Mick McLaughlin, Colin Addison, Tony Gough, Dudley Tyler, Billy Meadows, Brian Owen, Ronnie Radford. Hereford took Bobby Moore's West Ham to a fourth round replay and were elected to the Football League that summer.

The Newcastle team was: Willie McFaul, David Craig, Frank Clark, Irving Nattrass, Pat Howard, Bobby Moncur, Viv Busby, Tony Green, Malcolm Macdonald, John Tudor, Alex Reid.

1974/75 BURNLEY O v WIMBLEDON 1

Mick Mahon's goal early in the second-half gave Southern League Wimbledon a 1-0 FA Cup third round victory over First Division high-fliers Burnley in front of 19,683 at Turf Moor: Dickie Guy, Bob Stockley, Jeff Bryant, Dave Donaldson, Billy Edwards, Dave Bassett, Ian Cooke, Selwyn Rice, Roger Connell, Keiron Somers, Mick Mahon. It was the first time a non-League side had won away to top-flight opposition in the FA Cup since the war. The Dons held reigning League

Champions Leeds United to a 0-0 draw in the fourth round with Dickie Guy famously saving a Peter Lorimer penalty and narrowly lost 1-0 in the replay.

The Burnley team was: Alan Stevenson, Peter Noble, Keith Newton, Brian Flynn, Colin Waldron, Jim Thomson (Colin Morris), Billy Ingham, Ray Hankin, Paul Fletcher, Doug Collins, Leighton James.

1985/86 BIRMINGHAM 1 v ALTRINCHAM 2

Conference side Altrincham travelled to First Division Birmingham City in the FA Cup third round on 14th January 1986. Robert Hopkins scored at both ends during the second-half, with his own goal and Ronnie Ellis' volley giving the following Altrincham team a 2-1 win: Jeff Wealands, Phil Gardner, Peter Densmore, Jeff Johnson, Paul Cuddy, Peter Conning, Ronnie Ellis (Mike Farrelly), John Davison, Paul Reid, Colin Chesters, Gary Anderson. Altrincham had previously taken top-flight sides Everton and Spurs to FA Cup third round replays and were destined to win at Wembley in that season's FA Trophy final.

The Birmingham team was: David Seaman, Ray Ranson, Julian Dicks, Jim Hagan, Ken Armstrong, Martin Kuhl (Billy Wright), Des Bremner, Brian Roberts, Andy Kennedy, Nicky Platnauer, Robert Hopkins.

1988/89 SUTTON UTD 2 v COVENTRY 1

Coventry City had won the FA Cup two years earlier but were victims of a famous Cup upset in this third round tie at Gander Green Lane on 7th January 1989. Skipper Tony Rains' opener was equalised by Coventry's David Phillips but Matthew Hanlan's 58th minute goal gave the following Sutton United team a 2-1 win over the Sky Blues: Trevor Roffey, Robyn Jones, Tony Rains, Nigel Golley, Vernon Pratt, Paul Rogers, Micky Stephens, Phil Dawson, Lenny Dennis, Paul McKinnon, Matthew Hanlan. Coventry were lying fifth in the top-flight at the time. Sutton crashed to an 8-0 defeat at Norwich City in the fourth round.

The Coventry team was: Steve Ogrizovic, Brian Borrows, David Phillips, Steve Sedgley, Brian Kilcline, Trevor Peake, Dave Bennett, David Speedie, Cyrille Regis (Keith Houchen), Lloyd McGrath, David Smith.

2012/13 NORWICH 0 v LUTON 1

Conference side Luton Town stunned Premier League Norwich City at Carrow Road in the FA Cup fourth round on 26th January 2013. Norwich missed decent chances through Grant Holt and Leon Barnett before substitute Scott Rendell's 80th minute strike at the near post capped a monumental display by the following Luton team watched by 26,521: Mark Tyler, Ronnie Henry, Janos Kovacs, Lathaniel Rowe-Turner, Greg Taylor, Alex Lawless, Arnaud Mendy (JJ D'Donnell), Jonathan Smith, Jake Howells, Jon Shaw (Scott Rendell), Andre Gray (Stuart Fleetwood). The Hatters lost 3-0 at home to Millwall in the fifth round.

The Norwich team was: Declan Rudd, Russell Martin, Leon Barnett, Ryan Bennett, Javier Garrido, Elliott Bennett (Anthony Pilkington), David Fox, Jonathan Howson, Andrew Surman (Wes Hoolahan), Simeon Jackson, Harry Kane (Grant Holt).



2016/17 BURNLEY O v LINCOLN 1

Conference leaders Lincoln City gained a shock FA Cup fifth round victory over top-flight Burnley at Turf Moor on 18th February 2017. Sean Raggett's last-minute header gave the following Lincoln team a dramatic 1-0 win in front of 19,185: Paul Farman, Bradley Wood, Luke Waterfall, Sean Raggett, Sam Habergham, Nathan Arnold, Alex Woodyard, Alan Power, Terry Hawkridge (Joe Ward), Jack Muldoon (Dayle Southwell), Matt Rhead (Jamie McCombe). It was the first time a non-League club had reached the FA Cup quarter-finals for 103 years. The Imps lost 5-0 at eventual winners Arsenal in the next round.

Boreham Wood Football Club are delighted to Nottingham Forest. announce the signing of talented right-back. Jayden Richardson, who joins the club as a free agent, having previously been at SPFL side. Aberdeen.

The 24-year-old will wear the number 26 for Luke Garrard's side! Jauden's breakthrough campaign came in 2019/20 under Matt Taulor at Exeter City, where he featured in 28 games across League Two, the League Two play-offs, the EFL trophu and the FA Cup. The full-back found the back of the net on two occasions that season.

Richardson would then go on to join Forest Green Rovers on loan, for whom he would rack up 36 appearances over the 2020/21 season, gaining a lot more valuable experience in the English game.

Following this, Jayden would go on another loan, this time to Notts County of the National League at the time. The right-back would feature 25 times in the National League that season for the Magpies, accompanied by 2 outings in the Championship across the River Trent for his parent club at the time,

After his loan spell at Notts County, Richardson joined Scottish side, Aberdeen on a permanent transfer from Forest in July of 2022. The 24-uear-old featured 19 times in the SPFL during the 2022/23 season, his first experience of top-flight football.

Last season saw Jayden make two more loan moves, this time to Stockport County in July of last uear and to Colchester United earlier this year in January. Over these two loan moves, Richardson racked up a total of 22 more League Two appearances.

And that brings us to today as Jayden Richardson joins up with Luke Garrard and the squad, bringing a wealth of experience playing at some of the highest levels with him.

Jauden, in his first interview as a Boreham Wood player, stated that he hopes to "bring all of that experience to the side and help get the club back to where it belongs."




