

Today we welcome Weymouth to the Mangata Pay UK stadium. May I wish their Directors, Manager, players and supporters an enjoyable time with us and a safe journey home.

Well, after last season's relegation, it's admittedly been a more than decent start to our season, and that I believe is down to a good pre-season, good staff, good player retainment and good recruitment.

I say that because there has been far more inclusion in discussions, and a lot of intelligent decisions have been made at the clubs' top level, unlike last season. That said, let's not get too carried away as we are just 14 days into the new season... it's a good start but nothing more than that.

In terms of league performances, we have already beaten Bath City here and though dominant throughout we only nicked a win quite late on. We then went to Chesham United last Saturday and won 2-1 with a performance that in truth should have seen the game put to bed in the first 30 minutes.

We then went to Marc White's Dorking and drew 2-2, it was a game that saw two promotion seeking clubs go at it throughout, though I felt we out-footballed them for long periods. I appreciate it was not remotely a title decider in August, it was nonetheless an early season indicator of our squad strength and it was a definite indicator of our title aspirations and if we play like that over a season a lot of clubs at this level will struggle to live with us.

I feel I'm now qualified after 9 years of being an underdog club playing in the National League to say that the standards in the National South, albeit after just three games, will make things very interesting and very demanding for us.

It's also fair to say I can already see huge differences across this league and the league above in both playing and operational budgets, in stadia, pitch preparation, fan bases, squad sizes, and even the gulf in finishing, creativity and defending is at times noticeable and I most definitely see the differing levels in match officiating.

In truth the budgets regarding the league above are mind boggling, and when you couple that wealth with the size of their fan bases and the depth of those clubs overall spend and investment it probably shows most in the quality of their squads.

Those things alone show the real gulf between the NL South and the National League and the difference between certain clubs spending power, squad talent and future investment is honestly like night and day.

That said we stayed at NL level, and often challenged at the top end, for nine seasons. For a club like us to now stand any chance of winning a title outright this season in NL South, after our relegation, means we must accept our failures, starting again from scratch and understand we will possibly be a scalp for some clubs at this level, especially the local ones who will want to put one over us.

To be a scalp, is perhaps showing us a bit of respect, as we have earned a good reputation as a small club after what we achieved over the last decade or so. That said we must respect this level and our opponents each and every week, while making the most of our full time training programme and our full time environment. That said, we have set our sights on coming through a long hard season and our focus is only on promotion.

In truth we know we must work our socks off across the whole club and academy to succeed. We know we must be completely focused on improving ourselves as a collective, but we must also be fully focused and driven regarding our day to day approach to training and on all our onsite delivery to achieve our ambitions.

We must ensure we really do take advantage of our full time status, as the quality of our existing players I feel is unquestionable, plus our recent player recruitment has been very good and though we do now need further staff investment across our new management teams, even that is almost complete.

All of which means, I expected us to hit the ground running this season and the quality of our 19 man squad and new Management Team will of course be key to this season's success.

Will we be good enough, focused enough, driven enough, ambitious enough and will we be mentally strong enough to get back to the National League at the very first attempt?

Only time will tell, but we must accept after such a disappointing footballing year that our leadership levels, including mine, last season were nowhere near up to the standards I expect or we had previously set.

As such, only a real sea change at the top with a different mindset, work ethic, new energy alongside fresh ideas, coupled with a new group of players and a new management team at the helm who want to play entertaining football, can bring the town, club and supporters renewed hope and optimism.

After the very difficult decision to make my first managerial change in a very long time. I decided we needed to play a brand of football that was the polar opposite

of what we'd all got used to under the previous manager. Already I feel after long discussions with my Sporting Director Charlie Hunter, with other key staff, and my inner circle that we've done that with the appointment of Ross Jenkins, but there's still so much to do.

So at the risk of being called negative, I must emphasise after what I thought was a mixed, but also promising pre-season, and with it being just 14 days into a new season, that our levels with this new brand of football are still not quite where they will need to be if we want a promotion, a title and silverware this season, and our success can only be judged by promotion at the seasons end.

Many of you said changes were needed earlier than I perhaps made them last season, and In hindsight you were right, and I should possibly have acted earlier. Hindsight though is not something I ever mastered in my professional life or came to the club armed with - but I do admit a change of personnel in key areas before April 2024 was possibly what the club needed at the time.

What I will say, is that working with this amount of new people is a completely new challenge for me, as I've always been a creature of habit and more often than not I've shown loyalty and generosity to my staff in the difficult moments, especially if they were loyal, worked hard, not mean spirited, and if they had their colleagues welfare and the club at heart.

A change of Manager has though given me the spring and summer to re-set my emotions, my ambitions, my goals, and re-focus on what I consider to be the club's important core inner values, as I try and find the focus and money needed to create a new era and a new club beginning, with an exciting new tomorrow.

The upshot of the things I write in these

notes, has meant that on top of employing a new Head Coach, a new Assistant Head Coach, two new Academy Lead Coaches and a new Medical Lead, that other key backroom staff across the whole club were still needed after our relegation.

We must together rebuild things correctly and patiently and move forward with realistic ambitions. Also, we must include 'old school' values, understand the importance of a club's belief system and togetherness from the bottom up not top down, and we must ensure a care culture is in place, not just for a few people at the top but for all.

These things all sound very simple but good practice must always be worked at, it must also be completely understood by everyone and it must be the cornerstone of a winning philosophy and healthy club environment.

Everyone, and I mean everyone, must now buy into our club ethos, as our work ethic here has historically brought us huge success over the past two decades. I feel that message sadly got lost in recent seasons, as a me, me, me and social media culture took over the club, especially at first team level.

That said we have already addressed and thankfully got rid of the self-promoting social media culture, and we have already quietly regrouped as a club with our messaging this pre-season, and collectively we have agreed that we do not want to wash our dirty linen in public. We will leave self-promotion to others on social media, and will let our supporters know how we run and do things by ensuring our messaging in general and in these notes are informative.

We will still take care of our business, deal with our issues, communicate with our players and staff but quietly with no fuss. I want our messaging to be clear, we are a small and humble community football club.

We are not just about a first team and we are certainly not about the individual. Our mantra if we are to be successful, is about going back to the collective but also ensuring the welfare of each other from the bottom up is in place and for me that is non-negotiable.

After witnessing how pre-season and our league campaign has started, things are quietly gathering pace and are I feel changing for the better. I feel that with this new group of players and our new management team, they will give us a more rounded thought process to deal with setbacks and I feel we have a better self-perspective on how we might succeed.

I feel as a club (with some divisive and toxic elements now gone) we are thankfully back on the way to full recovery and certainly off life support. As such, I have decided to further improve my investment in the club, by improving our operational and playing budgets, by improving our community structures, and by further exploring and improving on my plans for the away end.... if I do that, and if our crowds steadily increase, then our club will continue to grow.

If Ross Jenkins, Mark Ricketts, Ross Weare and the dressing room can continue to improve things with their possession based football and philosophy, if they can create a winning mentality and, as a by-product, improve our Academy, then we can create a new culture off the park, where we can trust and rely on each other once again.

If we can do that then I feel we can challenge for promotion this season and possibly even win ourselves a title.

Before I wrote these notes, I've quietly analysed the last six months and held a series of very detailed and honest discussions with my Sporting Director, my Senior Management Team, my Academy Head, our Senior Medical Staff, our Senior Players and of course my day to day staff.

We have openly and very honestly addressed the issues from last season, and I feel it's brought a freshness in approach and brought us more together.

After those very honest conversations and our in-house reviews, and after the previous manager and his staff departed, it became clear to me that I would need to re-look at the way our first team and academy budget was being spent, how we went about player recruitment and look at how our associated staff recruitment was handled.... in truth the in-house review showed it was nowhere near the standards that we needed and had previously set.

Since last season, lessons have been learned and all communication lines across the club have been further improved and already I can see a real culture change. That, of course, shows itself in many ways, whether it's in peoples body language, their engagement in simple conversation, in getting rid of fear factors, improving standards and it's seen in simple changes to people's pre-conceptions, misconceptions, happiness and mindsets.

I have re-introduced more face to face staff meetings, I've gone back to including our first team management team in all of those important club meetings and communications where club and academy issues matter. I've gone back to more detailed face to face overviews, and slowly but surely with the personnel changes we've made, I'm once again happy to promote from within.

These small changes have rid the club of the "me, me, me" culture, as we needed a return of the "we are all in this together" culture. The outcomes of what we've already put in place this early in the season are of course still very much unknown - but it does mean our First Team, Academy, Medical Department, Community Department and day to day staff have all seen massive changes in key personnel over the last 3 months.

I feel in hindsight we all needed to change, and our key staff needed to strengthen their departments, with much more thought given over to recruitment, to relationships and with an emphasis on good housekeeping, for me the club is possibly now looking more efficient than it has for years and I'm thankful for that.

Back to today, where we welcome Weymouth Football Club to our humble Meadow Park abode. We last met Weymouth back in the National League a few years ago and since then they have had a few problems off the pitch I'm told, but now have a very good manager in Mark Moseley and will look to create a squad that returns them back to NL South challengers.

Even though they are sitting at the bottom of the league at present, it's at such an early stage that a league table is hardly worth looking at, and the reports I've seen say they are in a completely false league position.

Anyway whoever you support this afternoon let's hope for an open, attacking game and may the best team win.

Brooklyn GENSINI Born: Yeovil - 12 December 2001 Position: Right Back

Yeovil-born Brooklyn Gensini began his career at AFC Bournemouth, debuting in 2022 and scoring in a League Cup match against Norwich City, followed by a loan to Næstved in Denmark, where he scored his first goal in October 2022. In 2023, Genesini signed with Swindon Town and was loaned to his hometown club, Yeovil Town. Following release from Swindon in May, the young right-back joined Mark Moseley's Terras in July.



Tom BEARWISH
Born: Portland - 12 October 1999
Position: Midfield

Club captain of the Terras, Tom Bearwish began his playing career at Eastleigh, coming through the Spitfires' academy. The midfielder scored on four occasions for the Eastleigh first team before moving to Weymouth in June of 2021 and was named captain for the 2022/23 season, retaining his role throughout 2023/24 and the current season. Over the previous National League South campaign, Bearwish netted five times for the Terras.



Malachi LINTON
Born: Ipswich - 22 December 2000
Position: Froward

The Terras' number 9 initially joined the club on a loan move from Yeovil Town in January of last year, rejoining on a permanent deal in July. The centre-forward had spells with the likes of Wycombe Wanderers and Slough Town before his initial move to Weymouth last season, a season in which he scored 5. Notably, Linton scored in a 3-2 win over Tonbridge Angels on this season's opening day.

CLASSIC CAMPAIGNS

WEYMOUTH

Football historian LEIGH EDWARDS selects ten post-war Weymouth 'Classic Campaigns'

1954/55

Dave Massart and Marcel Gaillard netted 62 goals between them as Weymouth narrowly failed to win the Southern League title in 1954/55. Willie Fagan's side kicked off with a 3-2 defeat at Hastings but then won six of their next eight matches, with Dave Massart netting hat-tricks in home wins over Tonbridge and Bath City. He repeated the feat in a 4-3 victory at Kidderminster in October and the Terras won 6-2 in the return fixture five months later. Weymouth triumphed 4-3 at title rivals Yeovil Town and Marcel Gaillard netted four goals in a 5-1 win over Gravesend but the Terras were pipped to the title by Yeovil on goal average.

1961/62

Weymouth reached the FA Cup fourth round for the first time in 1961/62. Former Republic of Ireland international wing-half Frank O'Farrell was appointed player-manager and the Terras beat local rivals Dorchester 2-0, Barnet 1-0, Newport County 1-0 and Morecambe 1-0 in the FA Cup before losing 2-0 at Preston in the fourth round after the original match was abandoned due to dense fog. Ron Fogg was leading marksman, while other heroes included stalwarts Tony Hobson and Phil Stocker as well as veteran keeper Billy Bly. Weymouth hammered Cambridge City 8-1 in the Southern League and finished in sixth place.

1964/65

Barry Hutchinson was leading marksman with 35 goals as Weymouth won the Southern League title for the first time in 1964/65. Other new signings included Tommy Spratt, Andy Donnelly, Johnny Hannigan, Jack Hinchliffe and Alex Jackson. After starting with a 2-0 defeat at Cheltenham, the Terras lost only two of their next 20 Southern League games including a 7-3 demolition of Wisbech. Tommy Spratt scored five in a 7-1 win over Margate, then he and Barry Hutchinson grabbed hat-tricks in a 7-1 thrashing of Hastings. The Terras won the title with 56 points but lost 3-1 to Cambridge United in the Southern League Cup final.

1965/66

Weymouth retained the Southern League title in 1965/66. Stan Charlton replaced Torquay-bound Frank O'Farrell as manager and newcomers included Dudley Barry and Dickie Dowsett. The Terras kicked off with a 1-0 win at home to Wimbledon and were unbeaten in their opening six Southern League matches. They lost consecutive games against Poole and Folkestone but Roy Horobin arrived from Crystal Palace in October and inspired a 13 match unbeaten run. Weymouth took Bournemouth to an FA Cup first round replay and maintained their title bid. A six-match unbeaten finish saw them win the title with 57 points.

1972/73

Weymouth won the Southern League Cup for the first time in 1972/73. The Terras had been beaten finalists on four previous occasions but defeated Winchester City 5-0, Bideford 3-0, Bath City 2-1, Salisbury 2-1 and Worcester City 1-0 before goals by Ralph Miller, Tony Bimson and Alan Skirton secured an aggregate 3-0 victory over Hillingdon Borough in the final. It was former Welsh international full-back Graham Williams' first

season as Weymouth's player-manager, while other newcomers included Alan Skirton, Roy Gater and Alan Beer who was top scorer with 30 goals as the Terras finished sixth in the Southern League.

1977/78

Weymouth were runners-up in both the Southern League and Cup in 1977/78. Graham Carr succeeded Dietmar Bruck as manager and new signings included Kevin Dove, Peter Hawkins, Bob lles and Stuart Morgan. The Terras won their opening two matches before inconsistent results and crashed to a 7-2 defeat at home to Bath City on Boxing Day. They lost only one of their last 26 Southern League games, 2-1 at Kettering, but finished four points behind champions Bath. Peter Hawkins was top scorer as Weymouth were Southern League Cup finalists for the sixth time but lost 2-0 on aggregate to Gravesend 8 Northfleet.

1979/80

Tommy Paterson was leading marksman with 25 goals as Weymouth were Alliance Premier League runners-up in 1979/80. Other newcomers included Paul Arnold, Steve Chalk, Peter Johnson, Neil Merrick and future England star Graham Roberts. The Terras began life in the newly formed competition with a 0-0 draw at home to Altrincham and didn't win until their seventh match, 4-0 at home to Wealdstone. Stuart Morgan's side lost just one of their next 15 games and triumphed 6-0 at home to Redditch. They maintained their exciting late title bid with six successive wins but finished two points behind champions Altrincham.

1982/83

Weymouth reached the FA Cup third round for the first time in 21 years in 1982/83. Mark Baber arrived from neighbours Poole and Stuart Morgan's side lost only one of their opening eight matches. After a lean spell they hit top form in mid-season with seven successive Conference wins, also beating Cheltenham Town 4-0, Maidstone United 4-3

and Cardiff City 3-2 in the FA Cup before losing 1-0 at Cambridge United. Heroes included Kieron Baker, Anni lannone, Paul Arnold, Gary Borthwick, Trevor Finnigan and brothers Paul and Peter Morrell. Weymouth won only two of their last eight matches and finished seventh.



2005/06

Weymouth stormed to the Conference South title with a then club record 94 points in 2005/06. The Terras pulled away from their rivals and finished eight points clear of runners-up St Albans City, losing just once at home in the Conference South. They also reached the FA Cup first round proper for the first time in 20 years and Andy Harris' second-half equaliser clinched a shock 1-1 draw at Nottingham Forest. The Terras lost 2-0 in the replay watched by a record 6,500 crowd at Wessex Stadium and screened on national TV. Key players included Matthew Bound, Trevor Challis, Chukki Eribenne, Roy O'Brien and Steve Tully.

2018/19

Weymouth won the Southern League Premier title in 2018/19. The Terras dropped just two points in their opening five games, with Brandon Goodship grabbing hat-tricks at Harrow and Chesham. They remained top of the Premier Division South with a sevenmatch unbeaten run, then leading marksman Goodship netted further trebles against Frome and Met Police before four goals at home to Staines. They pipped Taunton to the title on the final day with a 3-0 win at home to Farnborough watched by 2,675. The overall championship play-off against Kettering finished 1-1 and Weymouth won 5-3 in the penalty shoot-out.






