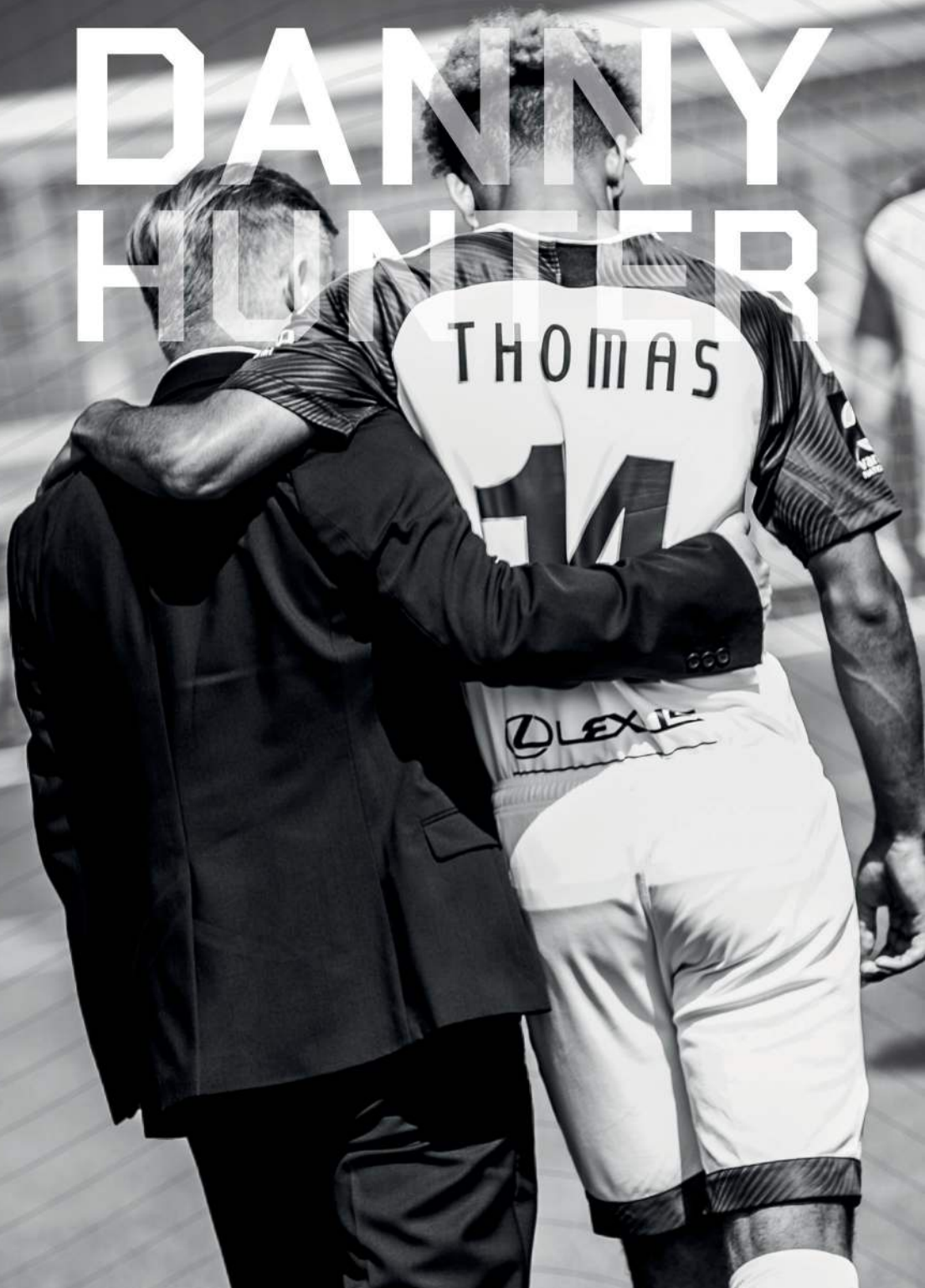

# DANNY HUNTER



***Today, we welcome Slough Town FC to the Mangata Pay UK stadium. May I wish their Directors, Manager, players, and supporters an enjoyable stay with us and a safe journey home.***

Well, with it being the first day of a New Year, and if I'm honest on both a football and health front, I was not unhappy to see the back of 2024. The club, my bank balance and perhaps even my health suffered during a hugely damaging relegation battle and our relegation also meant we lost important members of staff to pastures new.

It was also incredibly sad that during the year we lost our Founding Father, Club President Bill O'Neill, at the grand old age of 96 and also my good friend and one of our main sponsors and benefactors, Mr Alan Swan, of 'Wood Army' shirt sponsor fame.

That said, we have not for one moment stood still or felt too sorry for ourselves. In fact, I've ensured we got our heads down, worked hard and we have now improved the playing budget, the overall facility, our squad strength and even supplemented our academy staffing levels.

I've attacked relegation and our problems head-on by being brutally honest with myself, my family, my staff, and through honest and realistic messaging explained our wants, needs and ambitions to you supporters, our sponsors and to my partners. As such, I can now say with a lot more conviction, that we believe we can achieve a promotion back to the National League at the very first attempt, and if we fail, that's okay, but it will not be for the want of trying.

At our last home game on the 21st December against Tonbridge Angels, we also celebrated our annual Ladies Day. I'd like to thank Jodie, her bar staff and all those ladies who attended not only the game, but also the Karaoke in the Glass House after the game.

Despite the slightly disappointing 1-1 draw and team performance on the day, I think the Christmas Karaoke showed a club togetherness and for me the evening was a huge success. Certainly belting out a tune was great fun, the night was full of laughter and your humour and company were simply first-class.

Today though is not so much about laughs, as we will meet a very good Slough Town team and we know the problems they will cause. Their player manager Scott Davies is a very confident guy and he has done a great job since taking over the reins there and no doubt with his very good squad has aspirations of reaching the end-of-season play-offs.

As we now enter the second half of our season, it's fair to say after today, we've now played everyone in the division save for Hemel Hempstead and as the league table shows, it's not only close at the top, it's close at the bottom and the play-offs places, so this division is still too close to call, with every team capable of nicking a win.

Almost every week there are shocks, and at present relegation places, play-off places and who the title winners might be are still impossible to call - that said, in our case, we are most definitely back in the title and play-off conversation and I'm proud of Luke, Charlie and the players who've worked so hard in November and December to put ourselves back into a position to challenge.

Having written my programme notes before getting a final injury update after the Enfield Town game, I believe it's only Junior Dixon who might be unavailable today. If my information is accurate it still means the squad is incredibly strong for this afternoon's game and Luke will have 18 very good players to choose from.

The start of 2025 though does promise to be a pressure period if we let it consume us both on and off the pitch. That said, if you want sustained success whether in business, life, or in football, then pressure is your oxygen, your yardstick and something you must embrace.

All successful people use pressure to fuel them, as pressure especially in football means you're either doing something very badly like we did last season, or much better as we are doing this season.

Pressure at the bottom of any league in my experience, is something that can at times dominate you, consume your mind, eat you up and make you bitter and if you allow it, it can spread fear and create doubt regarding almost every footballing scenario or outcome.

Pressure at the top of a league, however, is a very different feeling and for me, it isn't pressure that dominates you. In truth I see it meaning as an owner that I'm doing my job, as it means our club, my staff and our squad are focused, driven and strong. It also means our squad is fit, it means we are once again winning the mind games and thus winning football matches.

Overall if pressure moments can be overcome, if pressure can be embraced, it is more likely to help you achieve your ultimate ambitions - but you must stay focused, must stay together, be hard-working, humble and remain driven.

Before the season started a lot was said on social media about who were this division's title favourites, as some clubs like ourselves were to remain or go full time. I think I even saw a stat that said this division now has around 17.5% to 20% of clubs either completely full-time or operating a hybrid full-time model.

Of those clubs Torquay United, Maidstone United, Dorking Wanderers, Truro City, Eastbourne Borough and us are all in and around the play-offs or in the title conversation and if I was pushed, I would expect the Champions to possibly come from one of those full-time clubs.

Whether we push on or fall away this season, it's my job to pay the bills and wages, to build this club from the bottom up and to spend wisely in all areas to create a bright future. In my position as the club chairman and owner, I must always try and fulfil your ambitions, while progressing our community football club both on and off the park. With our new plans for the South End of the ground now being drawn up, which includes the new South Stand and a close to 6,000 capacity, we are on course to do just that.

On the pitch, though, experience tells me we are about to enter the first big high and low period of the season where people tend to overreact to results. As such, we must all be both measured in our reactions and our responses.

After today we then get a well-earned two-week break from league action, as we go to Weymouth in the FA Trophy and if we can beat them, then our Saturday game at Truro in February will move to a midweek game which travel-wise is more problematic...that though is why I have invested in such a good squad and its why our increased squad size is needed if we are to succeed on two fronts.

In terms of player recruitment as I've said many times, if Charlie and Luke say there is an opportunity to sign further players of quality, and they're also the type of characters who possess the right attitude, discipline and desire, then I'm ready to facilitate that within reason.

I hope my continued financial backing can give our supporters, our club, our town and our community something to cheer about come April/May, but trust me, to be in the title conversation, further financial backing regarding tweaks to our squad is a must, as quality will be vital.

That said, you supporters must now play your part where possible, you must also bang the proverbial support drum, you must somehow help drive up our home support and help us get our crowd averages up as we need home support advantage. I say that, as I know your vocal support will get us decisions and that is going to be so, so important over the coming weeks and months.

Anyway, back to today, let's enjoy the raised expectations at the club, let's embrace the pressure of being around the top of the table and let's look forward to today's game, where two good teams will go head to head in search of the three points.

Finally, whoever you support let's hope for an open, attacking game and may the best team win.

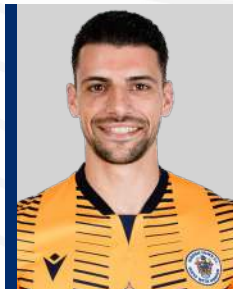


## Charlie HORLOCK

**Born:** 23 March 1995

**Position:** Goalkeeper

The shot stopper arrived at Arbour Park in the summer of 2024 after making a total of 273 appearances for Southern League Premier Division Central side, Hitchin Town. Horlock started his career at Wycombe Wanderers before spells at Stevenage, Harrow Borough and Hendon. Notably, the Rebels' number one managed to register his first career goal in November of 2023 as Hitchin defeated Halesowen Town, also saving a penalty late in the match.

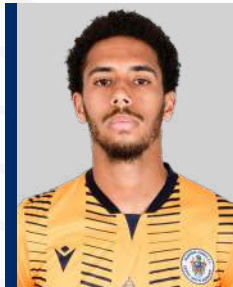


## Josh JACKMAN

**Born:** 22 March 1993

**Position:** Defender

The skipper at Arbour Park, Josh Jackman is a highly respected defender who joined the club from March Town United in the summer of 2016. Capable of adding a goalscoring threat from defence, leading to him being joint top scorer for the Rebels in the 2022/23 season, and has now appeared nearly 300 times for the Rebels. Normally employed as a right-back, Jackman can also play on the left.



## Leon PARILLON

**Born:** 5 November 2001

**Position:** Midfield

The 23-year-old came through the ranks at Oxford United and has represented a number of sides on loan, including a previous spell with the Rebels and a period playing alongside current manager, Scott Davies whilst at Biggleswade. The midfielder has netted four times so far this campaign and has grown into his midfield role at Arbour Park, making over 70 appearances for the club since joining in July of 2023.

# SLOUGH TOWN

Football historian **LEIGH EDWARDS** selects ten post-war Slough Town 'Classic Campaigns'

### 1972/73

Slough Town reached the Amateur Cup final for the first time in 1972/73. The Rebels beat Cadbury Heath 2-1, Eastbourne United 2-0, Leytonstone 2-1, Blyth Spartans 2-1 and Bishop's Stortford 1-0 to reach the Amateur Cup final. Slough trio Wolstenholme, D'Arcy and Day had played for Enfield in the 1970 final. The following Slough team lost 1-0 to Walton & Hersham at Wembley Stadium: Wolstenholme, Reid, Eaton, Mead, D'Arcy (Jamieson), Reardon, Chatterton, Day, O'Sullivan, Gaine, Anthony. Slough also retained the Athenian League Premier Division title, winning 22 of their 30 games and gaining 48 points, five ahead of runners-up Dagenham.

### 1980/81

Slough Town achieved the Isthmian League 'double' in 1980/81. The Rebels were pushed all the way by Enfield in a thrilling Isthmian League Premier Division title race. They won 23 of their 42 games under new manager Laurie Churchill and clinched the title with a late 2-1 win at Sutton United on the final day. Slough gained 82 points, finishing two ahead of runners-up Enfield. They also won the Isthmian League Cup, beating Horsham 2-1, Dagenham 3-1, Barton Rovers 3-1, Enfield 1-0 and Bishop's Stortford 3-2 to reach the final, defeating Hayes 2-0. Micky Kiely was ever-present top scorer as they also won the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup.

### 1982/83

Slough Town defeated Football League opposition in the FA Cup for the first time in 1982/83. The Rebels beat Salisbury 2-0, Basingstoke Town 2-0 after a 2-2 draw, Frome

Town 3-0 and Bideford 7-1 to reach the FA Cup first round proper for only the third time. Gary Attrell's goal gave the following team a 1-0 victory over George Graham's Third Division Millwall in front of a capacity 5,000 crowd at Wexham Park: Parsons, Yerby, Hutchinson, Maloney, Webster, Evans, Powell, White (Petty), Attrell, Russell, Dodds. Slough lost 4-1 at home to Bishop's Stortford in the second round. They finished seventh in the Isthmian League Premier Division.

### 1989/90

Slough Town won the Isthmian League Premier Division title in their 1989/90 centenary season. Former Chelsea striker Tommy Langley was a key figure as Alan Davies' side made an eight-match unbeaten start, including a 5-0 win at home to Redbridge Forest. The Rebels gained a record 10-1 FA Trophy third qualifying round win at Stroud. They went top of the table with a 3-2 victory at home to Carshalton in mid-December. Slough regained pole position with six straight wins but lost 2-0 at Redbridge Forest and needed a last-gasp equaliser to draw 4-4 at Carshalton. They clinched the title with a dramatic 1-0 win at Bromley on the final day.

### 1994/95

Slough Town regained Conference status at the first attempt in 1994/95. The Rebels lost just one of their opening 15 Isthmian League Premier Division games under new manager Dave Russell. They also reached the FA Cup first round but lost 4-0 to Birmingham City in front of 13,394 at St Andrews. Mark West grabbed a hat-trick in their 4-0 victory at home to Marlow and was leading marksman as Slough finished runners-up with 79 points. They were promoted



after champions Enfield failed to meet the necessary financial criteria. The Rebels were also Isthmian League Cup finalists but lost 7-6 on penalties after a 1-1 draw with Aylesbury United.

#### **1997/98**

Slough Town reached the FA Trophy semi-finals in 1997/98. Brian McDermott's side beat Welling United 2-1 after a 1-1 draw, Halifax Town 2-1 after a 1-1 draw, Boreham Wood 2-1 after a 1-1 draw and Stevenage Borough 1-0 to reach the semi-finals for the first time in 21 years. Slough lost 1-0 at home to Southport in the first-leg but Danny Bailey equalised in the second-leg before Southport triumphed 2-1 on aggregate. Slough also reached the FA Cup first round proper and Danny Bolt scored as they drew 1-1 against Cardiff City in front of 2,262 at Wexham Park. The Rebels lost 3-2 in the replay. Striker Lloyd Owusu joined Brentford in July 1998.

#### **2003/04**

Slough Town returned to the Isthmian League Premier Division in 2003-04. Eddie Denton's side steadily climbed the table after an inconsistent start and won 5-1 at home to Banstead Athletic. They slammed four goals past Bromley and Horsham in consecutive matches, then Ian Hodge netted four goals in their 7-1 victory at home to Epsom & Ewell, also grabbing hat-tricks against Horsham and Windsor & Eton. 'Player of the Year' Ian Hodge and Tony Boot scored 61 goals between them as Slough won 28 of their 46 Isthmian League First Division South games and qualified for the Isthmian League Premier Division in fourth place with 90 points.

#### **2004/05**

Slough Town won the Isthmian League Cup for the second time in 2004/05. Eddie Denton's side beat Cheshunt 1-0, Salisbury City 3-0, AFC Wimbledon 4-2 and Heybridge Swifts 4-2 to reach the final. Two goals by Ian Hodges plus another from Josias Carbon secured a 3-1 victory over Hampton & Richmond Borough. Slough also reached the FA Cup second round proper for the first time in 18 years. After beating Croydon Athletic 1-0, Welling United 4-1, Cheshunt 4-0

and Salisbury 3-2, goals by Ian Hodges and Glen Harris gave the Rebels a 2-1 first round win at home to Football League opponents Walsall. They lost 3-1 to Yeading in the second round.

#### **2013/14**

Slough Town won promotion to the Southern League Premier Division in 2013/14. New managerial duo Neil Baker and Jon Underwood brought the majority of their Godalming Town squad with them to Slough. The Rebels won 26 of their 42 Southern League First Division Central games. They were the highest scorers with 101 goals, winning 7-1 at North Greenford and scoring five goals against Ashford Town (Mx), Aylesbury United, Chalfont St Peter and Kettering Town. They qualified for the play-offs in fifth place with 83 points. After beating Rugby Town 3-0 in the semi-final, they gained a thrilling 3-2 win over Kettering 3-2 in the final.



#### **2017/18**

Slough Town won promotion to the Conference South in 2017/18. They began with a 2-1 defeat at home to Kettering Town but lost just one of their next 15 Southern League Premier Central games, winning 8-1 at home to Dunstable and scoring five goals in both matches against Gosport. The Rebels also won 6-0 at Gainsborough Trinity in the FA Cup first round and their 4-0 second round defeat at home to Rochdale was televised by BT Sport. They won 30 of their 46 games and scored 111 goals, qualifying for the play-offs in third place with 99 points. After winning 3-1 at home to Kettering Town in the semi-finals, they beat King's Lynn 2-1 in the final.
