DANNY HUNTER

Today we welcome Hemel Hempstead Town to the Mangata Pay UK Stadium. May I wish their Directors, Manager, players and supporters an enjoyable stay with us and a safe journey home.

Well, first of all it's only correct that I get the hello's and pleasantries out of the way, as we say hello to two very good friends of mine and this football club, in legendary ex Wood Manager Mr Ian Allinson who won two Play-offs and two promotions with us and his son, ex-Wood player Lee Allinson, who also helped us win a Play-off during his time with us. Ian and Lee now head up Hemel's management team, though Lee is now an ambitious young manager in his own right and Ian is now the 'old head' assisting his son and it's clear they are doing great things together over at Hemel Hempstead.

They are a close family who I've had some incredible times with having holidayed with them, attended or hosted them for weddings, anniversaries, funerals, birthday parties and all things in between. In truth I've known them all for a very long time, so I also know that this afternoon's encounter is more than just a game for them, for me and for our families and that makes it personal.

Why? Because we are competitors and winning is in our DNA, so no matter what the relationships are prior to the game that goes out of the window come 3pm this afternoon as we will want to go out there and give it to each other for 90 plus minutes. Only when the game is over can our friendships take over once again, can the win at all costs mentality dissipate and then the beers and all our stories of yesteryear can flow.

Trust me, I know Ian and Lee will greet me with a warm handshake and an assassin's smile haha. I also know they will want to kill off our Play-off aspirations and in truth I would expect nothing less - all of which makes today's game more personal as it comes complete with local pride, local emotion, bragging rights and the real danger of us dropping out of the Play-offs.

A week though is a very long time in football and over the last week or so I feel we might have just started to turn a bit of a corner, as

Luke tweaked a few things formation wise last Saturday and I feel he also possibly tweaked his own and some other peoples mindsets. If I'm honest I feel the changes Luke made were much needed, I feel it certainly got a good reaction and that, along with Luke getting a player back from suspension and a few lads back off the treatment table, also helped enormously with the formation change.

Based on last week's performance, I think even a few of our younger lads are finally starting to understand that now is the time for them to be brave and hit some form. I feel they are only just starting to understand that it is how they perform week in and week out in those pressure moments of a season, that will give them a real career to look back on in the future with no regrets. Whether it's a last ditch tackle, a final ball or getting on the end of something, it's now all about them being able to produce those magic moments in the big games that lay in front of us over the coming month.... I accept for all young players there will be setbacks but trust me the mentally strong in football deal with them and get stronger.

As such I now need our manager, our senior players, our youngsters to be brave by freeing themselves of any fear of failing and let me deal with the pressure of what league we're in next season, what next year's budget might look like and all the boring stuff in between that the dressing room need not concern themselves with. Now is the time for our dressing room to enjoy each other, enjoy training, enjoy the big games by being brave, showing real belief, showing their strength and by being confident in their own ability and quality, as they search for their own success and magic moments.

I want them to know that this club through me, my staff and what we've all built, is strong both mentally and financially both on and off the pitch and they need to free their minds up in terms of any fear of failure and simply picture what glory and success might look like.

No more doubting themselves, just trust in the Club, trust in Luke and in each other and let me and only me, worry about next season and what division we eventually end up in. The truth is really simple, the worst thing that can happen to us is that we wake up in May and we're still in this division and when the doubters and keyboard warriors pipe down, the bookies will open up their betting lists and we'll be one of the early season favourites to go up next season.

As such, promotion pressure is just not something the dressing room needs to worry about, as I've already done my sums, I've already got a plan, I've already got a budget in place to compete and I'm more than ready to make tweaks and changes to improve us and go again.

I just want my staff and our dressing room from top to bottom, to see the Play-offs for what they are, they are a winner take all, 2 or 3 game cup competition but in our case it is a complete free hit.... Why? Because having won them twice as an underdog club, I know how difficult they are to win if you burden yourself with unnecessary pressure, if you burden yourself with over-the-top expectation and if you create an unnecessary favourites tag. As such I'll leave that to the likes of Torquay United and some of the other bigger fan bases.

That said, I know that the Play-offs will be pressure no matter what we say, but it's a good pressure, it's also the most exhilarating way to go up and I have fortunately experienced that feeling twice, and those memories trust me will never leave me.....

Firstly though, we must focus only on today, as we must get ourselves to the Play-offs, which means we must re-focus on one game at a time, we must get our mindsets right, we must get our running stats up and we must understand you cannot win football matches or the Play-offs if you have players that cannot run, tackle and compete for 90+ minutes and we must maximise this very talented squad.

Talent in my opinion though will only take you so far, it's then more about your manager and your dressing room knowing who they are, it's about them showing the right attitude, discipline and desire and it's about them having a winners mentality and being brave. I believe if you show those attributes, if you work hard and have a bit of Lady Luck along the way, then your collective effort and belief will do the rest.

Last weeks 3-0 win, admittedly against a tired looking Salisbury team who were made look very poor, gave me renewed hope, as we ran the legs out of them and in truth it should have been 5 or 6, as we also missed a penalty and wasted a sack full of chances and numerous good goal scoring positions.

What was clear from last week's performance, was that we had legs back in the side and they operated further up the park, the players were making forward runs again and those forward runs were made with real intent and not going down cul-de-sacs. It was also clear that our players and supporters were again enjoying the team's work rate, the tempo of the game and the players played with a freedom both as individuals and as a collective that we hadn't seen for a while.

As a Chairman I am always as supportive as possible and as honest as you can be with Luke, my inner circle, my staff and the players in this new woke world. As such, in light of our recent slide I asked to address Luke, our associated staff and the players in person eight days ago and Luke very graciously allowed me to do that. I simply spoke to them about life, about my expectations, about keeping things real, I asked them to accept personal responsibility at times and to be brave. I asked them to clear their minds in regards to their own perceived pressures and I asked them to simply work hard, to support each other and to run - we also covered a few other things in an honest way but my words were hardly rocket science.

To put some perspective on why I wanted to address this young group of people, Luke had told me of his proposed formation tweaks earlier in the week and had asked me to give him some very honest feedback that involved my thoughts on him bringing one or two players back into the starting XI, which I was very happy to do.

In business terms though, Luke was in fact being brave as he was restructuring his own beliefs/business plan on the field of play, based on player availability, on injuries, on form and on a loss of form, and doing it with just five games of the season to go is a gamble. As such, as an experienced older head, I knew if it went wrong then we had young players and young staff who needed to know prior to these changes that there would be no repercussions or a blame game culture played out, certainly not from me.

As such I just felt that with the formation change coming and some of the team changes being proposed, that any unnecessary pressure felt by the players and staff, must be alleviated at the outset and our clubs work ethic and ethos must be explained to some of our newer, younger players and staff. My feedback to Luke was, as always, measured, as I would never tell him who to pick, but do if asked occasionally offer up simple observations or messaging. Only simple things that we all know you must do in this league, in that you must have legs, you must be able to run, tackle and compete. You must be brave all over the park both in and out of possession and you cannot play fear football by being afraid to lose a game.

Draws and being fearful will not help us in our situation and I would much rather we go all out for a win than play for a draw and if we lose a few games along the way going for it, then so be it. For me credit where credit is due, as I felt Luke, his staff and the dressing room got it spot on last week as we ran, we were brave, our boys covered the ground, they tackled, they competed, they excited the crowd and of course I know it's just one game but any unbeaten run has to

start somewhere, so long may that bravery continue.

Luke will this afternoon hopefully have one or two of his experienced older heads back from injury in Kwezi Appiah and Femi Ilesanmi and that is more good news for the dressing room, as we now have 19 fit players to choose from for the run in, which just leaves Chris Bush, Josh Hare and David Agbontohoma in the treatment room.

Chris after his heart issues is doing remarkably well and through expert consultants, expert advice and expert treatment, we are now expecting the big fella to be available within the next 10 days or so. Please remember that Chris's "back to play" date is just a guide and we'll need to see how he deals with full contact in training and how things might develop on the mental side of things.

Josh Hare however is not such good news, as he suffered another concussion in the Maidstone United game and got a nasty cut to his head into the bargain. As such with the protocols regarding head injuries, Josh will not be ready to play again until at least the first play off game if we get there. That said it's an area thankfully where we do have great cover.

David Agbontohoma is another defender who in reality has had a disrupted last two seasons here due to a variety of injuries. He rolled his ankle in training a month ago and is still around a week away from being available, but again on a positive note he's now not that far away.

So as we enter the final two weeks of the normal season our promotion ambitions are still alive, our squad is starting to get back to full fitness at just the right time and It would be nice for Luke to have some of our big guns returning as the Play-offs come ever closer.

If we make the Play-offs, then I expect some of our big players to deliver in those big moments, it's where those magic moments

do happen for someone each and every season. I believe that others are now quietly writing us off, but I say they do that at their peril as this squad does have quality, we still have a great cup pedigree under Luke and the desire is most definitely there.

So if we can gain some momentum in the last four games starting today, if we can remain positive going into a winner take all, 2 or 3 game cup competition, then in truth who knows?

Can I finish by thanking the players, staff, sponsors, supporters and partners of our club and community, for making our upcoming Gala Dinner and Players Presentation evening a SELL OUT. It's always a great club night and it gives me a chance to thank so many people for their incredible efforts and sacrifices over a long, hard season and trust me if you own a non league football club you genuinely do have plenty of people to thank.

Lastly, whoever you support let's hope for an open, attacking game and may the best team win.





Allinson took over at Vauxhall Road in December after Hemel experienced a freefall down the Vanarama National League South table under the management of Bobby Wilkinson and, since then, has taken the Tudors up to 10th.

Kyle AJAJI

Born: 17 July 2000

Position: Defender

The Hemel skipper is now in his fifth season at Vauxhall Road since arriving from Dunstable Town in 2020. Renowned for his strength and power in the backline, the defender was named the club's Player of the Season for 2023/2024, a campaign which saw him reach the milestone of 100 appearances and demonstrate remarkable consistency by missing only one league game. Ajaji's solid defensive performances and reliability have made him Tudors fan favourite.



Oliver LYNCH

Born: 2 November 2004

Position: Forward

Lynch joined up with Lee Allinson's Tudors on loan from Luton Town until the end of the current campaign, having been with the Hatters since joining at Under-14 level. The forward has previously gained experience through various loan spells away from his boyhood club, including stints with Hitchin Town and Dulwich Hamlet, and has made a huge impact during his time at Vauxhall Road so far, netting seven National South goals.



Joe WHITE

Born: 16 January 1999

Position: Forward

26-year-old attacker, Joe White kicked off his career at Dagenham & Redbridge before spells at Wealdstone and Stevenage. A move in 2018 to Biggleswade Town saw him amass 36 goals in 57 games before a move to Hendon in 2019, in which he netted on 73 occasions. Following in the footsteps of manager Lee Allinson, the forward left the Greens and arrived at Vauxhall Road in December.

CLASSIC CAMPAIGNS

HEMEL HEMPSTEAD

Football historian **LEIGH EDWARDS** selects ten post-war Hemel Hempstead Town 'Classic Campaigns'

1981/82

Hemel Hempstead reached the FA Vase fifth round in 1981/82, the club's best-ever performance in the competition. Tony Horsfall's side beat Barkingside 2-0 in the FA Vase first round, then defeated Flackwell Heath 2-0 in a second round replay. The Tudors triumphed 3-2 at home to Rainham in the third round, then beat Redhill 2-1 to reach the FA Vase fifth round for the first time. The following team lost 3-1 to Cheshunt at Vauxhall Road: Mazurek, Goodson, Doyle, Warner (Wilson), East, Power, Byrne, Conroy, Hoar, Maguire, Pattison. Hemel Hempstead finished mid-table in the Isthmian League Second Division with 54 points.

1997/98

Hemel Hempstead won the Isthmian League Third Division title in 1997/98. Mick Vipond's side began with a 6-0 win at home to East Thurrock and Josh Price scored four times in a 7-0 victory at Southall as they were unbeaten in their opening five games. Josh Price grabbed a hat-trick in a 3-0 win over Croydon Athletic and Hemel Hempstead lost just two of their final 27 matches, hammering Flackwell Heath 7-0 and Ford United 6-0 at the end of the season. Josh Price was leading marksman with 24 goals as they won 27 of their 38 games. The Tudors had the best defensive record and gained 87 points, finishing four ahead of runners-up Hertford Town.

1999/00

Hemel Hempstead stormed to the Isthmian League Second Division title in 1999/2000. Neil Price's side lost their opening match 3-1 at Wingate & Finchley but soared to the top with six straight wins and trounced both Banstead

Athletic and Edgware Town 8-0 in October. Craig Ravenscroft grabbed a hat-trick in their 5-2 victory at home to Tooting & Mitcham, then Gary Winks emulated the feat in a 7-1 demolition of Metropolitan Police. The Tudors remained unbeaten in their final 22 games. Vince Somers was top scorer as they gained a record 101 points, finishing five ahead of runners-up Northwood, but were denied promotion due to ground grading.

2005/06

Hemel Hempstead won promotion straight back to the Southern League Premier Division in 2005/06. Steve Bateman's side won 22 of their 42 Southern League First Division West games, winning 6-2 at home to Leighton Town and slamming five goals past Beaconsfield SYCOB, Burnham and Dunstable Town. Anthony Thomas was leading marksman as they charged up the table and qualified for the play-offs in fourth place with 75 points. The Tudors defeated Swindon Supermarine 3-0 in the semi-finals, then beat Brackley Town 3-2 in the play-off final. Grant Carney was captain, while Steve Smith and Paul Edgeworth were also key players.

2006/07

Hemel Hempstead qualified for the Southern League Premier Division play-offs again in 2006/07. Anthony Thomas grabbed a hat-trick as they kicked off with a 4-1 win at home to Cirencester. Garry Sippetts scored five times in their 6-3 FA Cup first qualifying round win over Leyton. The Tudors soared up the table with just one defeat in 15 matches, including six straight wins. Sippetts and Thomas scored 26 goals apiece as they qualified for the play-offs in fifth place, losing 3-1 to Team Bath in the semi-finals.

They lost 3-2 to Tiverton Town in the Southern League Cup final and were also beaten finalists in the Herts Senior Cup and Herts Charity Cup.

2008/09

Hemel Hempstead reached the Southern League Premier Division play-offs for the second time in three seasons in 2008/09. The Tudors started brightly, winning 5-1 at Rugby Town and 6-1 at Stourbridge. Five straight wins included a 3-1 victory over leaders Farnborough. Paul Byrne replaced Steve Bateman as manager in February, just before they beat Ware 2-1 in the Herts Charity Cup final. Eight wins in 11 matches in the closing weeks enabled them to reach the play-offs in fifth place. They lost 4-3 on penalties after a 0-0 draw at Farnborough in the play-off semi-finals. Drew Roberts, Anthony Thomas and Chris Dillon scored 46 goals between them.

2012/13

Hemel Hempstead reached the Southern League Premier Division play-off final in 2012/13. They won their opening four games under new manager Dean Brennan, including a 6-0 victory at Bashley, then regained pole position with a 6-1 win at home to Bedworth United in mid-October. The Tudors remained top for three months, storming to an 8-2 win at home to Hitchin. Dave Pearce and Matt Nolan scored 21 goals apiece as they qualified for the play-offs in fourth place. They beat Chesham United 2-0 in the semi-finals but lost 5-4 on penalties after a 2-2 draw with Gosport Borough in the final. They won the Herts Senior Cup for the first time in 87 years.

2013/14

Hemel Hempstead won the Southern League Premier Division title in 2013/14. The Tudors lost their opening match 2-0 at Hitchin but went on to win ten consecutive games and spent most of the season well clear at the top. They were also in the draw for the FA Cup first round proper for the first time in 75 years after drawing 3-3 with Sutton United but lost the replay. Hemel Hempstead hammered Bashley 10-0 and AFC Totton 8-1 in quick succession. They clinched the title with a 4-0 victory at Hungerford and defeated Chesham 2-1 in their final home match

watched by a 1,943 crowd. Ben Mackey scored a club record 43 goals in all competitions.

2014/15

Hemel Hempstead reached the FA Cup first round proper for the first time in 2014/15. They won 2-0 at home to Dunstable Town in the FA Cup second qualifying round, then swept to a 5-0 win at Chippenham Town in the third qualifying round and beat Nuneaton Town 2-0 after extra-time in a fourth qualifying round replay. James Potton gave the following team an early lead at Bury in the first round proper but they lost 3-1 after two late goals: Walker, Asafu-Adjaye, Johnson (Toomey) (Simmonds), Diarra, Connolly, Talbot, Daly, Parkes, Potton (Lowe), Hawkins, Thorne. The Tudors also reached the FA Trophy third round and won the Herts Senior Cup.



2017/18

Hemel Hempstead qualified for the Conference South play-offs in 2017/18. They began with a 3-0 victory at home to Whitehawk and overcame an inconsistent start to lose just once in 16 Conference South games, rising to second place by November. The Tudors triumphed 5-0 in the return match at Whitehawk and an eight-match unbeaten run during the closing weeks enabled them to qualify for the play-offs in fifth place. It was the club's highest-ever finish but they lost 3-2 on penalties after a 0-0 draw with Braintree Town. They also reached the Herts Senior Cup final but conceded the match to Hitchin due to safety concerns about the playing surface.

GULLS STILL IN THE MIX

Torquay United manager Paul Wotton remained optimistic despite a frustrating 2-1 home defeat to Chesham United, which dropped his side to fifth in the National League South.

Despite the setback, Torquay are still just three points behind new leaders Truro City in a tightly contested title race. Jordan Dyer gave Torquay a first-half lead, but Chesham equalised early in the second half and sealed the win with a late goal from Alex Laffleur. Wotton lamented missed chances and poor decision-making, particularly in the final third, and criticised the referee's handling of time-wasting tactics.

He noted that key players, including Matt Jay and Jordan Young, underperformed, and the team became disjointed late in the game. Wotton emphasised the need to regroup ahead of their next match against Slough, stating that with four games left, Torquay must stay focused and continue to fight in a title race full of twists and turns.



MAITLAND VOWS QUICK RETURN

Weymouth chairman, Paul Maitland called the club's relegation "extremely painful" following their 4-1 loss to Eastbourne Borough, which confirmed their drop to the Southern League Premier.

Reflecting on the season, Maitland apologised to supporters, volunteers, and sponsors for the disappointing outcome, expressing deep gratitude for their unwavering support, and vowed to rebuild with the goal of an immediate return to the National League South. Despite the setback, he emphasised that the club would not dwell on self-pity but focus on using the lessons learned to come back stronger, thanking those who supported the club through difficult times.


